Gettysburg Remembrance Day

“Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.”

This year's 146th anniversary of Lincoln's Gettysburg Address was shared by the Tulsa Sons of Union Veterans, Indian Nations Camp #3 and the Rachel Cormany Auxillary #2, to the SUVCW, as well as by Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, 1861-1865.

Carol Cox, who holds dual membership in the Auxillary as well as Tent #19 DUVCW, repeated the cherished words of the Nation's 16th President.

“Lincoln's two-minute speech at the dedication of the National Soldiers' Cemetery in Gettysburg on November 19, 1863, was one of the most memorable speeches in American history. Delivered less than five months after the battle, and while half the bodies of the fallen had not yet even been disinterred from their hasty graves and moved to the cemetery, it was a model of eloquent brevity.” To learn more, go to www.nationalparkstraveler.com
