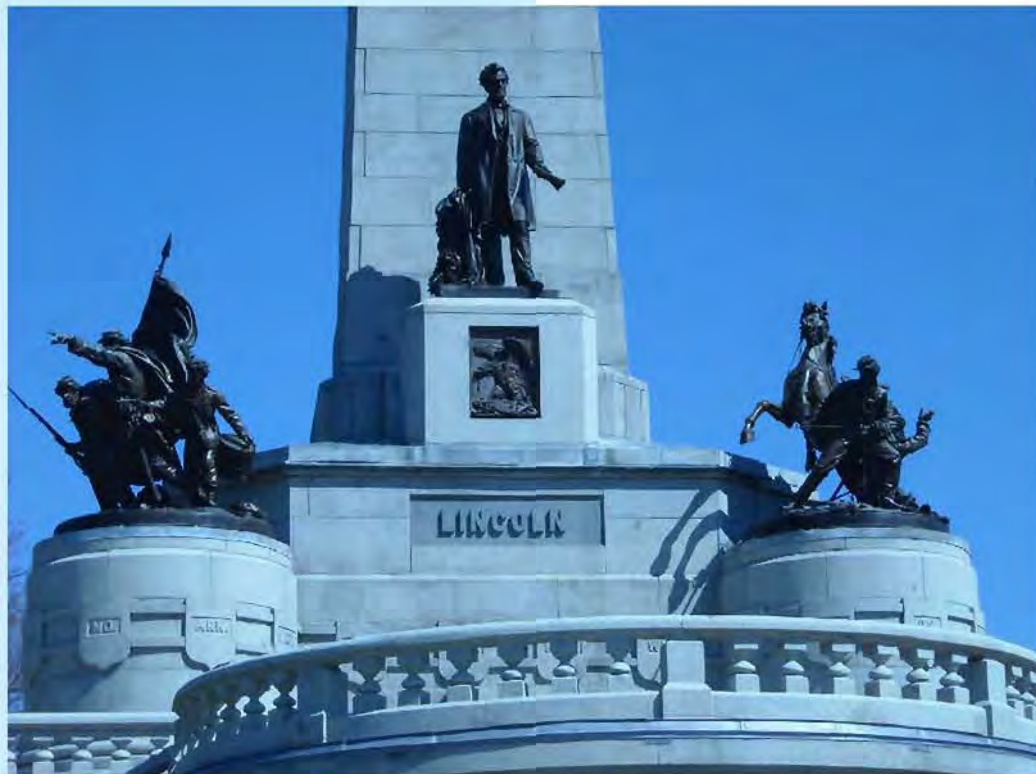


Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, 1861-1865
